Admission criteria

The MEDFOR Masters Course is open to non-EU and EU students. Admission requires:

- A good first university degree
- High proficiency in English
- Strong personal statement of motivation
- Good recommendations from two references, of which at least one is academic
- CV


The application form and applicants's requirements are available at www.medfor.eu.

Application deadlines for scholarships are usually in December/January and for self financed students in June/July each year before lecture start at the end of September.

At the time of application, you must supply proof of your BSc degree as well as the required language test.

Language of Instruction

All MEDfOR courses are held in English.



Student Scholarships

Every year approx. 17-20 Erasmus Mundus scholarships are available.

Category A Scholarships for Third-country nationals of TOTAL € 48,000: these scholarships can be awarded to students from all countries other than the 27 EU member states and EEA/ EFTA states.

Category B Scholarships for EU nationals of TOTAL € 20,000: these scholarships can be awarded to any masters student who does not fullfil the criteria defined for Category A.

Self financed students have the possibility to apply for mobility grants of the Mediterranean Office for Youth (MOY).

Participation Costs

The participation cost is the same irrespective of study track/institution. The participation cost per year is € 8,000 for Category A students and € 4,000 for Category B students. The participation cost per year is € 3,000 in the case of self financed students.

Course Structure

MEDfOR is a 2-year Master programme (120 ECTS) encompassing 3 semesters of coursework plus a Summer School and 1 semester to prepare the Master dissertation.

Students are required to spend at least one semester to complete 30 ECTS in at least two institutions in two different countries. Moreover they will meet in a joint Summer School that will take place in the 2nd semester.
